ACTIVITY IDEAS FOR SCHOOLS

Easy In-School Activities

- Teachers and administrators can hand out National School Choice Week (NSCW) wristbands to students.
- 2. Hang homemade posters in the school's hallways, and have students and teachers pose for photos.
- 3. Have students fill out our "I Love My School" placards, and share photos of the students holding them online using #schoolchoice.
- Have students make a quick video about why they love their school, and share it with us.
- Encourage students to decorate their lockers or classroom doors, and announce the winners during NSCW.
- Have a "Yellow Day" on which students and teachers wear yellow clothing or accessories. Or have a "Spirit Week" with a different theme each day.
- 7. Have a student dress-down day on which students dress outside of their normal uniforms.
- 8. Combine fun and learning with free, printable activity sheets and decorations. Download them from our website at schoolchoiceweek.com/printables.
- 9. Students can learn and perform the NSCW dance, film it, and then upload it to YouTube. Tag us and use #schoolchoice. Watch the tutorial at www.schoolchoiceweek.com/dance.
- 10. Invite a local dignitary, such as your mayor or a county leader, to visit your school and talk with students.
- 11. Launch a contest to design the school's yearbook cover or school flag.
- Have students bring in and decorate t-shirts or paint a school wall or mural.

Learning Activities

- 1. Plant a community garden during NSCW.
- 2. Develop a special class, play, or video about your school's history.

Activities to Increase Enrollment

- 1. Arrange school tours or an open house for prospective students and their parents.
- 2. Conduct interviews with local radio and television shows to promote your school.
- 3. Share what you love about your school on social media during NSCW. Tag us and use #schoolchoice.

Community Activities

- 1. Hold a student poster & essay contest, & publish winning submissions in your local newspaper.
- Take photos with students and teachers wearing their NSCW wristbands at recognizable community landmarks.
- 3. Have students design and complete a community service project, take pictures, and share it online.
- Students, parents, and teachers can attend a local city council, school board, or county commission meeting and speak briefly about what school choice means to them.

Appreciation Activities

- Have teachers write and send thank-you letters home with students for their families
- Encourage students to keep a gratitude or thankfulness journal during NSCW, detailing the different ways in which they are grateful for their parents and for their school.
- Give students construction paper or note cards and ask them to write notes to their parents, thanking them for choosing your school.
- 4. Have students share at lunch the reasons why they are grateful to attend your school.
